Webinar: Health disparities: using data and health literacy techniques to reduce inequalities

Date: Thursday 20 October 2022, 12.30pm

Nearly half the adults in England (43%) struggle to access, read and understand health information. When that information includes numbers as well as words, this rises to 61%.

This means important details, such as how to take medicines and dosage, understanding appointment letters and test results can be missed – and not everyone feels confident to say when they don't understand.



With online appointments and health resources, health literacy is increasingly underpinned by digital access and skills.

To address health disparities, we need to focus on improving health literacy, digital literacy and digital access. In this session you will find out about how to use our newly available maps and online tool using place-based geodata to identify levels of health literacy and digital access in your area.

The session will also introduce techniques and resources to help to address inequalities caused by differences in ability to access and use health information. This includes our health literacy eLearning programme. You will have the opportunity to review potential to address local health disparities.
